We follow the calendar of the Diocese of Corpus Christi, so June is the first month of their fiscal year. A new year comes with new goals and commitments! As a board, we are finally meeting in person after 14 months of Zoom meetings!!

We have added a few new board members and are ready to get back to work planning the 2022 weekends. We're so excited at the thought of welcoming new pilgrims to our JTD Community! But we cannot do it alone. We absolutely need and welcome your help in bringing new people into our Community.

Think back to when you were invited to attend. Maybe you were hesitant. Maybe you were intrigued. Then think about how you felt AFTER the weekend was over. Was it a feeling of renewal? Of hope? Of commitment to being the fishermen we are all called to be? Weren't we created to help one another?

As a government contractor, I think back to five years ago when I was given an opportunity to bid on a grounds maintenance contract for the Navy. I asked my employees for help, but they had no clue. I asked my business associates, but they had no clue. I asked family and friends, but they had no clue. All I heard was: "Sorry, but I have no idea." I was beginning to feel so defeated because I was going to have to give the opportunity back and say, "NO QUOTE." I went home one Friday night and found two of my reunion group ladies waiting at my house. They could tell I was stressed and asked what was wrong. I explained to them how frustrated and overwhelmed I felt. One of them said to me: "I will help you."

Those four little words gave me hope beyond explanation. My spirits were lifted immediately, and the weight of the world was released from my shoulders. That weekend the two of us started with basic attempts in putting the package together. I was only given three weeks to get a 25-page bid package together, but WE did it. We were awarded the contract. It amazed me that all I really needed was SOMEONE to offer help; to let me know I wasn't alone. So don't ever turn down an opportunity to tell someone: "I will help you." That help could easily be an invite to a Journey Weekend. You never know the hope you could bring to someone in a critical time of need.

## Some Words from the Wise

### From the desk of Deacon Rey Rojas

Love is patient, love is kind, It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 1 Corinthians 13: 4-5

As I reflected on many years of service in various capacities, I have found myself hurt by others, I have also hurt others, and I am sure that I have hurt others that I did not even know that I have hurt. I selected this particular reading for both of my daughter's weddings and have reflected on it many times.

Do you recall your first Journey or Walk? I was a newly ordained deacon assigned to a spiritual formation that I knew nothing about. The weekend had been very moving and reached deep into my heart. I have heard Isaiah 6:8 many times and it was very familiar with the hymn "Here I am, Lord". That evening as I listened to the hymn that I knew well, at the question "Whom shall I send?", involuntarily my hand went up. I often hear that question when I find myself upset with someone, or myself, or I recognize a need that needs attention. Many years ago, I heard a story that often comes back to me, and I would like to share it with you.

Night after night, she came to tuck me in, even long after my childhood years. Following her longstanding custom, she'd lean down and push my long hair out of the way, then kiss my forehead.

I don't remember when it first started annoying me—her hands pushing my hair that way. But it did annoy me, for they felt work-worn and rough against my young skin. Finally, one night, I lashed out at her: "Don't do that anymore—your hands are too rough!" She didn't say anything in reply. Never again did my mother close out our day with that familiar expression of her love. Lying awake long afterward, my words haunted me. But pride stifled my conscience, and I didn't tell her I was sorry.

Time after time, with the passing years, my thoughts returned to that night. By then I missed my mother's hands, missed her goodnight kiss upon my forehead. Sometimes the incident seemed very close, sometimes far away. But always it lurked, hauntingly, in the back of my mind.

Well, the years have passed, and I'm not a little girl anymore. Mom is in her mid-seventies, and those hands I once thought to be so rough are still doing things for me and my family. She's been our doctor, reaching into a medicine cabinet for the remedy to calm a young girl's stomach or soothe a boy's scraped knee. She cooks the best fried chicken in the world . . . and still insists on dishing out ice cream at any hour of the day or night.

Through the years, my mother's hands have put in countless hours of toil, and most of hers were before perma-press fabrics and automatic washers!

Now, my own children are grown and gone. Mom no longer has Dad, and on special occasions, I find myself drawn next door to spend the night with her. So it was that late one Thanksgiving



Eve, as I drifted into sleep in the bedroom of my youth, a familiar hand hesitantly stole across my face to brush the hair from my forehead. Then a kiss, ever so gently touched my brow.

In my memory, for the thousandth time, I recalled the night my surly young voice complained: "Don't do that anymore—your hands are too rough!" I reacted involuntarily. Catching Mom's hand in mine, I blurted out how sorry I was for that night. I thought she'd remember, as I did. But Mom didn't know what I was talking about. She had forgotten—and forgiven—long ago.

That night, I fell asleep with a new appreciation for my gentle mother and caring hands. And the guilt I had carried around for so long was nowhere to be found.

As we pray and prepare our hearts for the formation of teams for the Journey to Damascus 2022 season and the pilgrims that will participate and join our community, let us find peace though love and forgiveness. I hope that this story prepares us for similar stories that we will encounter. Let us keep in mind ST. Paul's letter to the Corinthians where here teaches us the many attributes of love.

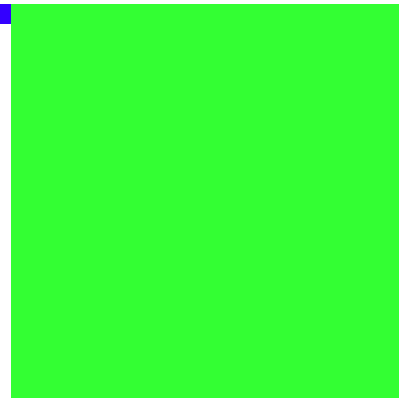
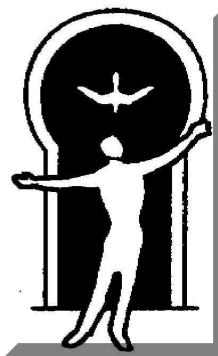
